Twenty Four people attended an airport meeting on April 20<sup>th</sup> at the IOOF Hall, where the main topic was the status of the Airport Layout Plan (ALP). The ALP is an official plan to guide future changes or growth as needed for the airport, and projects out for 20 years, but is updated every 10 years, and recommended to be reviewed every 5 years in order to keep up with needs and FAA regulations. Steve Wagner, the County Contractor presented an impressive display of full color 3X4 feet art boards outlining the present status and recommendation for the airport based on present conditions and estimated future needs. Some of the topics covered at the meeting were a landing pad for helicopters, additional hangers ( 4 new hangers have been approved with the possibility to acquire permission to build a total of 6) additional tie down spaces, and an extension to the south end of the runway with additional threshold displacement.

The FAA's predictions are that the growing general aviation fleet will include more of the recent growth in Very Light Jets, which are reported to be smaller, quieter and slower approach speeds.

The students in Ms. Gills' class at Coffee Creek School will be having a Car Wash – Bake Sale on Saturday, April 29 from 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. The proceeds from this event, to be held at the Coffee Creek School, will be used for the 8<sup>th</sup> grade graduation trip. Francie Epperson's K-3 class is expecting baby chicks to hatch around April 28. Mrs. Buehler donated two incubators and provides the fertilized eggs, which take 21 days to incubate. After the chicks arrive, the student “Mother and Father Hen's” place them in a brooder box, and it becomes their responsibility to love them, feed, water and clean the brooder box.
