AMENDMENT TO ORDINANCE NO. 2

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE TRINITY CENTER COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT that Section 7. Amendments made in the Uniform Fire Code, subsection (a) and adopted February 9, 1971, be deleted and in its stead the following:

SECTION 7. AMENDMENTS MADE IN THE UNIFORM FIRE CODE.

- (a) The Uniform Fire Code is amended and changed in the following respects:

Section 13.30, Paragraph 6, is added as follows:

In any future subdivision of land in any manner established within the Trinity Center Community Services District the Fire Chief shall designate the number and location of fire hydrants within such subdivision of lands. Such fire hydrants shall be located not more than five hundred (500) feet apart along the street front of those streets located within said subdivided lands. Any future continuation of a street, the five hundred (500) feet along a street spacing will be maintained. Fire hydrants shall be of a dry barrel type, having no less than two (2) 2-1/2 inch national standard thread outlets and so constructed that when the hydrant is turned off the hydrant barrel will be automatically drained into a gravel filled seepage pit below the frost line. (Kennedy Model K-11 or equal). Hydrants shall be installed on no less than a six (6) inch main with a six (6) inch flanged gate valve on the lateral at the base of the hydrant. A standard box or sleeve with cover shall provide access to the valve stem. Upon compliance with this section by the subdivider the Fire Chief shall furnish the subdivider a letter of approval to be filed with the appropriate agencies and subdivision agencies.

SECTION 13. DATE OF EFFECT.


This amendment is made to bring Trinity Center Community Services District Ordinance No. 2 in compliance with that certain code known as the Uniform Fire Code as recommended by the California Fire Chief's Association and to correct a transmittal error, therefore, this amendment will take effect immediately upon being published at least once in the Trinity Journal within fifteen (15) days after its passage.


